Eddy & Kim Lawrence will be appearing at the Covered Bridge Coffeehouse in Jay, NY on February 22, 2008 at 7 PM. The coffeehouse is located in the Amos & Julia Ward Theatre, on Route 9N on the Village Green of Jay. Admission is \$5.00.

Eddy Lawrence is a critically acclaimed songwriter, musician, and recording artist who lives in Moira, NY. ***Acoustic Guitar Magazine*** calls him a “great picker and killer songwriter”. He has been described in ***Sing Out!*** as a “brilliant, quirky writer”. ***Dirty Linen*** calls his last album, “Inside My Secret Pocket”, “a pure delight”, and says “With a cynical eye and wry sense of humor, Lawrence exudes a world-weary attitude that is reminiscent of John Prine at his smarmy best.”

In concert, Lawrence is known for his humorous way with a story and his fluid flatpicking and fingerstyle guitar work. He is accompanied by his wife Kim, who plays upright bass. The duo’s new CD, “My Second Wife’s First Album”, has just been released by Snowplow Records. It is their first recording together, and the ninth album of Lawrence’s original songs.

In addition to his own recordings, Lawrence has worked as a producer, session musician, and recording engineer on releases by other artists. Two of the albums that he produced and played on were nominated for Native American Music Awards (NAMMYS) in 2006 & 2007.

Eddy’s songs have appeared on many compilation albums, including NPR’s ***Car Talk Tunes*** and nine Fast Folk albums, which have been acquired by the Folkways division of the Smithsonian.
